

## HADHRAT AMIR'UL MUMINEEN MUHYI-UD-DIN

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## (Summary of Friday Sermon)

After having greeted all his followers (and all Muslims) round the world with the Salutations of Peace, Hazrat Muhyi-ud-Din (atba) read the Tashahhud, Taouz and *Surah* Al Fatiha and then said:

وَإِن مِّنْ أُمَّةٍ إِلَّا خَلَا فِيهَا نَذِيرٌ ۞

Wa 'immin 'ummatin 'illaa khalaa fiihaa naziir.
"There is no nation but has had its Warner." (Fatir 35: 25)

All nations received revelation. There is an important question which relates to the person of God and man and that which subsists between man and man; in other words; which nations have been the recipients of revelation and on what principles were they selected by God to receive His revelation? Without the solution of this question, the reform which the Promised Messiah had attempted in relation to other questions relating to the being of God, would not have been complete. With regard to this question he pointed out that, as God is the Lord of the whole universe, his guidance could not be confined to any particular nation. As he is the Lord of all mankind and has equipped all of them with thinking minds, he could not deprive any nation of His guidance. As I have recited in the beginning of my sermon: "There is no nation but has had its Warner". (Fatir 35: 25)

God has sent His messengers among all nations and in all ages, and as the sun lights up the whole world, the light of revelations has ever lit up the darkest corners of the earth. If today we cannot discover the light of revelation among a particular people, it does not mean that no prophets have appeared among them, but the truth is that these peoples have allowed their national traditions and faith to die out. In pursuance of this doctrine this testified to the truth of Krishna, Ram and Buddha, the prophets of India, and all the other prophets, messengers and reformers of Almighty God, and the rejection of their claims is, in a sense, amounting to a denial

of the universal providence of God. Why accept some and reject some? Why not accept all as of divine source? This is a doctrine which was not to be found among the teachings of any sect or religion, and, as a matter of fact, the majority of people believe that revelation had been confined to the founders of their respective religions, and even those who believed that revelation had been vouchsafed to people of other religions did so, more as a sort of personal tribute to the founders of those religions on account of the services rendered by them to the cause of humanity than as a result of the acceptance of the doctrine of the universal providence of God.

But the Promised Messiah demonstrated from the Quran that not only were those men the righteous servants of God whose services to humanity are recorded in history, but that the attributes and the words of God alike bore witness to the fact that every nation, whether its traditions have been preserved or not, has had its prophet, and that to receive guidance through prophets was the right of humanity which God would never ignore. The extent to which this doctrine has opened to all nations the doors of the Love of God, has placed the internal relation of mankind on a basis of concord and amity, and has secured the founders and righteous men of all religions against insult and abuse.

Then reflect upon how fortunate is Islam to have received such a prophet whose essence has proclaimed that it has been revealed and implemented as a religion and way of life for all mankind and has honoured all the previous prophets as well as the future prophets whose essence shall be exclusively of Islam and of the most dignified and hallowed of prophets, the seal of all prophets, Muhammad (pbuh)!

The Promised Messiah Mirza Ghulam Ahmad (as) came to show the beauty of Islam and the wonderful relationship which binds him to Allah and the Holy Prophet Muhammad (pbuh), without whom his claim to prophethood is nullified. No independent prophet shall come who shall come to change the laws of the Quran and implement another divine book of laws. There is no prophet who shall come who shall be as grand and majestic and perfect as the Holy Prophet Muhammad (pbuh). But it is an undeniable truth that there are such prophets who shall come who shall lose themselves completely in the love of Allah and the Holy Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) that they shall become the perfect reflection of the best of mankind and prophets (pbuh). These little Muhammads shall be torches of light in the darkness of the end of days to bring back the people of all religions, including Muslims back to the fold of Islam, of the true faith with which they were born.

Indeed the Promised Messiah Hazrat Mirza Ghulam Ahmad (as) has said in his book "Ek Ghalati Ka Izala" – A Misconception Removed:

"In short, the term Khatamun Nabiyyin is the Divine Seal which has been set upon the Prophethood of Muhammad (pbuh). <u>It is now impossible for this seal ever to be broken</u>. <u>What is possible, however, is that the Holy Prophet (pbuh) may appear in the world in the form of a Buruz (reflection), not once, but even a thousand times, and may, by way of Buruz, proclaim his</u>

<u>Prophethood with all its splendour and perfection</u>. The advent of such a Buruz was ordained by God Almighty, as He says:

## وَاخْرِيْنَ مِنْهُمْ لَمَّا يَلْحَقُوا بِهِمْ ا

Wa 'aakhariina minhum lammaa yal-haquu bihim And among others from among them who have not yet joined them. (Al-Jumu'ah 62:4)"

Allah has sent prophets, messengers, messiahs and reformers in the past to all nations. Now, it is prudent to say that Allah has stopped talking and shall send no more prophets and reformers to the new generations of man inhabiting this world? If they do not receive a Warner, a messenger of God to warn, should we be in a position to blame them for their erring ways? Indeed, Allah is never unjust towards His creatures! Until the day comes when there remains not a single man/human on earth, there shall continue to be prophets of Allah to come to warn people of their acts, and to bring them back to the fold of <u>Islam</u> — complete submission to the Almighty. Where there are people, nations, there shall be Warners who shall come for them to warn them and also give them the glad tidings of Allah's love and mercy should they reform and accept to do the will of God on earth until they are no more alive on their temporal abode.

The blessings of Allah when He sent His beloved most perfect servant, the glorious man, the seal of prophethood to earth with the perfect religion and way of life, Islam, it is an indication that from now on, the world has got a perfect role model to follow, to mould their existence into his existence, to copy him, to become his *Buruz* (reflection) and *Zill* (shadow). Many reflections of the Holy Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) shall come who shall represent the living glory of Islam. But the truly fortunate ones shall indeed be those whom Allah has purified even before their advent of earth by designating them as prophets of God and reformers of Islam, such prophets who shall be the bearers of the torch of Islam and its truth among the people of the world, the global nation. This is indeed the main difference between the nations of old and the present and future nations. The yesteryears nations received such prophets who came to foretell of the excellence and the time of the birth of the best of mankind, whereas we the present nation, as well as the future nations, whenever prophets arise from among us, we shall have to hallow that perfect man and re-establish for him his honour whenever he is abused by others. The abusers and their abuses are of no avail when the wrath of Allah overtakes them for Allah is ever the Protector and Preserver of the honour of His prophets, come what may.

Hazrat Mirza Ghulam Ahmad (as) has furthermore proclaimed in his book "Ek Ghalati ka Izala":

"Since I am the Buruz of Muhammad (pbuh) that has been ordained since eternity, I have, therefore, been granted Prophethood in the form of Buruz, and the entire world is powerless to stand against it, for a Seal has been set upon Prophethood. A Buruz of Muhammad (pbuh) was destined to come in the latter days with all the perfections of Muhammad (pbuh), and so he has come. Now this is the only window through which one can get water from the fountainhead of Prophethood."

Hazrat Mirza Ghulam Ahmad (as) was indeed such *Buruz* and *Zill* of the Seal of Prophethood (pbuh) for his era, and indeed Allah like promised blessed his Jamaat which represents the niche of Islam from which shall arise other Muhammads and Ghulam Ahmads who shall keep alive the honour of these blessed servants and messengers of Allah, such men who represent the key to the door of salvation, be it in this world and the hereafter. This is because of their undeniable love for Allah, and the close bonds which prophets of Allah are given to share with each other for the love and pleasure of Allah. Indeed the love of Hazrat Mirza Ghulam Ahmad (as) for Allah and His beloved prophet Muhammad (pbuh), the best of mankind and prophets is indeed boundless.

May Allah keep blessing mankind with His devoted prophets who safeguard **Islam** in the heart to guide the lost nations of tomorrow. *Ameen, Summa Ameen.*
